INTRODUCTION

The IJSS is designed so that members of staff have the opportunity to gain a greater understanding of the knowledge and skills that are required for other/similar roles within their institution internationally. Participants spend time working alongside a member of staff within a different School/Department; either by nomination or identifying an area of interest.

INTERNATIONAL JOB SHADOWING / PLACEMENT GUIDELINES

AIMS

Participation in a one week post-to-post shadowing with the host school will provide participating staff with the opportunity for:

- Professional refreshment
- First-hand experience of another education system
- Discovering new ideas to bring to the classroom/school environment

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Applications should be sent 8 weeks before date of travel. The principal/headteacher of the school must countersign the application form confirming agreement to the exchange/placement.

DURATION

The placement may take place at any time during the academic year provided that the host school visited is in session. The minimum duration of the placement must involve <u>five</u> working days in host school and <u>three</u> days for the COMPULSORY briefing and de-briefiing session when you arrive in the host country. The sessions will outline your emergency contact details, what to expect, how to make the most use of the IJSS and current updates in educational pedagogy. A maximum of <u>ten</u> days is required for the IJSS. Participants will be visited by a member of our team during your stay at the host school.

COSTS

- Registration form and processing £150 (non-refundable)
- £1,000 per participant
- Participants are responsible for their own indemnity insurance, police clearance certificate, travel and accommodation
- Accommodation may be organised as a paying guest in the host school or in a hotel
- Additional fees for visa assistance and airport transfers- please ask for further information
